

LEG-400-301 Terms and Conditions of Purchase

1. ACCEPTANCE OF CONTRACT/TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- (a) This Contract integrates, merges, and supersedes any prior offers, negotiations, and agreements concerning the subject matter hereof and constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.
- (b) SELLER's acknowledgment, acceptance of payment, or commencement of performance, shall constitute SELLER's unqualified acceptance of this Contract.
- (c) Unless expressly accepted in writing by BUYER, additional or differing terms or conditions proposed by SELLER or included in SELLER's acknowledgment are objected to by BUYER and have no effect.
- (d) The headings used in this Contract are inserted for the convenience of the parties and shall not define, limit, or describe the scope or the intent of the provisions of this Contract.

2. APPLICABLE LAWS

- (a) This Contract and any matter arising out of or related to this Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its conflicts of laws provisions. SELLER, in the performance of this Contract, shall comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws, orders, rules, regulations, and ordinances. SELLER shall procure all licenses/permits, pay all fees, and other required charges and shall comply with all applicable guidelines and directives of any local, state, and/or federal governmental authority. SELLER, at its expense, shall provide reasonable cooperation to BUYER in conducting any investigation regarding the nature and scope of any failure by SELLER or its personnel to comply with applicable local, state, and federal laws, orders, rules, regulations, and ordinances that may affect the performance of SELLER's obligations under this Contract.
- (b) SELLER represents that each chemical substance constituting or contained in Work sold or otherwise transferred to BUYER hereunder is, as applicable, on the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) Chemical Substances inventory compiled by the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to TSCA (15 U.S.C. Sec. 2607(b)) as amended and implemented in 40 CFR Part 710; and is designated as "active" pursuant to the TSCA Inventory Notification Rule (codified by amendments to 40 CFR Part 710 effective August 11, 2017).
- (c) SELLER shall make available to BUYER all Safety Data Sheets for any material provided to BUYER, or brought or delivered to BUYER or its customer's premises in the performance of this Contract as required by applicable law, such as the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 and regulations promulgated thereunder.
- (d) Work delivered by SELLER under this Contract may be incorporated into deliverable goods for use in the European Economic Area (EEA) and subject to the European Union Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH); the Classification, Labeling and Packaging Regulation (EC) No. 1272/2008 (CLP); and the Biocidal Products Regulation (EU) 528/2012) (BPR).

- (1) SELLER represents and warrants that the Work and any substances contained therein are not prohibited or restricted by, and are supplied in compliance with REACH, CLP, and BPR, and that no current requirement in REACH, CLP, or BPR prevents the sale or transport of SELLER's Work or substances in SELLER's Work in the EEA, and that all such Work and substances have been preregistered, registered, reported, approved, and/or authorized as and to the extent required by REACH, CLP, and BPR.
- (2) SELLER shall timely respond to any request from BUYER with all relevant information on the Work so that the intents of REACH, CLP, and BPR are met for communicating with downstream users (e.g., as defined in article 3(13) of REACH [any person established in the EEA using substances in the course of that person's industrial or professional activities; the definition does not include the manufacturer, importer, distributor, or consumer]), and in any case, SELLER shall provide all information necessary for BUYER and any downstream user to timely and accurately fulfill their obligations under REACH, CLP, and BPR.
- (3) SELLER shall bear all costs, charges and expenses related to pre-registration, registration, evaluation, authorization, reporting, and approval under REACH, CLP, and BPR.
- (4) Seller shall comply with the Conflict Minerals provision (Section 1502) of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act and its implementing regulations. Seller has in place a supply chain policy and processes to undertake a reasonable inquiry into the country of origin of Conflict Minerals incorporated into Goods it provides BUYER as necessary to determine if Conflict Minerals sourced from the DRC countries directly or indirectly support unlawful conflict there. Seller shall provide Buyer the results of said inquiry upon Buyer's request and in a format acceptable to Buyer.

3. ASSIGNMENT

Any assignment of SELLER's Contract rights or delegation of SELLER's duties shall be void, unless prior written consent is given by BUYER. Nevertheless, SELLER may assign rights to be paid amounts due, or to become due, to a financing institution if BUYER is promptly furnished a signed copy of such assignment reasonably in advance of the due date for payment of any such amounts. Amounts assigned shall be subject to setoff or recoupment for any present or future claims of BUYER against SELLER. BUYER shall have the right to make settlements and/or adjustments in price without notice to any assignee financing institution.

4. CHANGE IN CONTROL OF SELLER

Prior to a potential change of control of SELLER and at least ninety (90) days prior to the proposed effectiveness of such change of control, SELLER will promptly notify BUYER in writing thereof, and provide the identity of the potential new controlling party and information on such party and the transaction as BUYER may request, consistent with applicable law and confidentiality restrictions.

5. CHANGES

(a) The BUYER Procurement Representative may at any time, by written notice, and without notice to sureties or assignees, make changes within the general scope of this Contract in any one or more of the following: (i) drawings, designs, or specifications; (ii) method of shipping or packing; (iii) place of inspection, acceptance, or point of delivery; and (iv) delivery schedule.

- (b) If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of this Contract, BUYER shall make an equitable adjustment in the Contract price and/or delivery schedule, and modify this Contract accordingly. Changes to the delivery schedule will be subject to a price adjustment only.
- (c) SELLER must assert its right to an equitable adjustment under this clause within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the written change order from BUYER. If SELLER's proposed equitable adjustment includes the cost of property made obsolete or excess by the change, BUYER shall have the right to prescribe the manner of disposition of the property.
- (d) Failure to agree to any adjustment shall be resolved in accordance with the "Disputes" clause of this Contract. However, nothing contained in this "Changes" clause shall excuse SELLER from proceeding without delay in the performance of this Contract as changed.

6. CONTRACT DIRECTION

- (a) Only the BUYER Procurement Representative has authority on behalf of BUYER to make changes to this Contract. All amendments must be identified as such in writing and executed by the parties.
- (b) BUYER engineering and technical personnel may from time to time render assistance or give technical advice or discuss or effect an exchange of information with SELLER's personnel concerning the Work hereunder. No such action shall be deemed to be a change under the "Changes" clause of this Contract and shall not be the basis for equitable adjustment.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided herein, all notices to be furnished by SELLER shall be in writing and sent to the BUYER Procurement Representative.

7. COUNTERFEIT WORK

(a) The following definitions apply to this clause:

"Counterfeit Work" means Work that is or contains unlawful or unauthorized reproductions, substitutions, or alterations that have been knowingly mismarked, misidentified, or otherwise misrepresented to be an authentic, unmodified part from the original manufacturer, or a source with the express written authority of the original manufacturer or current design activity, including an authorized aftermarket manufacturer. Unlawful or unauthorized substitution includes used Work represented as new, or the false identification of grade, serial number, lot number, date code, or performance characteristics.

"Suspect Counterfeit Work" means Work for which credible evidence (including, but not limited to, visual inspection or testing) provides reasonable doubt that the Work part is authentic.

- (b) SELLER shall not deliver Counterfeit Work or Suspect Counterfeit Work to BUYER under this Contract.
- (c) SELLER shall only purchase products to be delivered or incorporated as Work to BUYER directly from the Original Component Manufacturer (OCM)/Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM), or through an OCM/OEM authorized distributor chain. SELLER may use another source only if (i) the foregoing sources are unavailable, (ii) SELLER's inspection and other counterfeit risk mitigation processes will be employed to ensure the authenticity of the Work, and (iii) SELLER obtains the advance written approval of BUYER.

- (d) SELLER shall maintain counterfeit risk mitigation processes in accordance with industry recognized standards and with any other specific requirements identified in this Contract.
- (e) SELLER shall immediately notify BUYER with the pertinent facts if SELLER becomes aware that it has delivered Counterfeit Work or Suspect Counterfeit Work. When requested by BUYER, SELLER shall provide OCM/OEM documentation that authenticates traceability of the affected items to the applicable OCM/OEM. SELLER, at its expense, shall provide reasonable cooperation to BUYER in conducting any investigation regarding the delivery of Counterfeit Work or Suspect Counterfeit Work under this Contract.
- (f) This clause applies in addition to and is not altered, changed, or superseded by any quality provision, specification, statement of work, regulatory flow-down, or other provision included in this Contract addressing the authenticity of Work.
- (g) In the event that Work delivered under this Contract constitutes or includes Counterfeit Work, SELLER shall, at its expense, promptly replace such Counterfeit Work with genuine Work conforming to the requirements of this Contract. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Contract, SELLER shall be liable for all costs relating to the removal and replacement of Counterfeit Work, including without limitation BUYER's costs of removing Counterfeit Work, of installing replacement Work and of any testing necessitated by the reinstallation of Work after Counterfeit Work has been exchanged. The remedies contained in this paragraph are in addition to any remedies BUYER may have at law, equity or under other provisions of this Contract.
- (h) SELLER shall include paragraphs (a) through (f) and this paragraph (h) of this clause or equivalent provisions in lower tier subcontracts for the delivery of items that will be included in or furnished as Work to BUYER.

8. DEFAULT

- (a) BUYER, by written notice, may terminate this Contract for default, in whole or in part, if SELLER (i) fails to comply with any of the terms of this Contract; (ii) fails to make progress so as to endanger performance of this Contract; (iii) fails to provide adequate assurance of future performance; (iv) files or has filed against it a petition in bankruptcy; or (v) becomes insolvent or suffers a material adverse change in financial condition. SELLER shall have ten (10) days (or such longer period as BUYER may authorize in writing) to cure any such failure after receipt of notice from BUYER. Default involving delivery schedule delays, bankruptcy or adverse change in financial condition shall not be subject to the cure provision.
- (b) Following a termination for default of this Contract, SELLER shall be compensated only for Work actually delivered and accepted. BUYER may require SELLER to deliver to BUYER any supplies and materials, manufacturing materials, and manufacturing drawings that SELLER has specifically produced or acquired for the terminated portion of this Contract. BUYER and SELLER shall agree on the amount of payment for these other deliverables.
- (c) Upon the occurrence and during the continuation of a default, BUYER may exercise any and all rights and remedies available to it under applicable law and equity, including without limitation, cancellation

of this Contract. If after termination for default under this Contract, it is determined that SELLER was not in default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

(d) SELLER shall continue all Work not terminated or cancelled.

9. DEFINITIONS

The following terms shall have the meanings set forth below:

- (a) "Contract" means the instrument of contracting, such as "Purchase Order", "PO", "Subcontract", or other such type designation, including these General Provisions, all referenced documents, exhibits, and attachments. If these terms and conditions are incorporated into a "master" agreement that provides for releases, (in the form of a Purchase Order or other such document) the term "Contract" shall also mean the release document for the Work to be performed.
- (b) "BUYER" means Enflite, LLC, as identified on the face of this Contract.
- (c) "BUYER Procurement Representative" means a person authorized by BUYER's cognizant procurement organization to administer and/or execute this Contract.
- (d) "SELLER" means the party identified on the face of this Contract with whom BUYER is contracting.
- (e) "Work" means all required labor, articles, materials, supplies, goods, and services constituting the subject matter of this Contract.

10. DISPUTES

- (a) All disputes under this Contract that are not disposed of by mutual agreement may be decided by recourse to an action at law or in equity. Each party hereby irrevocably waives, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, any right it may have to a trial by jury in respect to any litigation directly or indirectly arising out of under or in connection with this Contract.
- (b) Until final resolution of any dispute hereunder, SELLER shall diligently proceed with the performance of this Contract as directed by BUYER.

11. ELECTRONIC CONTRACTING

The parties agree that if this Contract is transmitted electronically neither party shall contest the validity of this Contract, or any acknowledgement thereof, on the basis that this Contract or acknowledgement contains an electronic signature.

12. EXPORT CONTROL

- (a) SELLER shall comply with all applicable U.S. export control laws and economic sanctions laws and regulations, specifically including but not limited to the International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR), 22 C.F.R. 120 et seq.; the Export Control Reform Act of 2018; the Export Administration Regulations, 15 C.F.R. 730-774; and the Foreign Assets Control Regulations, 31 C.F.R. 500-598 (collectively, "Trade Control Laws").
- (b) SELLER shall notify BUYER if any deliverable under this Contract is restricted by applicable Trade Control Laws. Before providing BUYER any item or data controlled under any of the Trade Control Laws,

SELLER shall provide in writing to the BUYER Procurement Representative the export classification of any such item or controlled data (i.e. the export classification under the EAR, ITAR, EU List of Dual Use Items and Technology, Wassenaar Arrangement's List of Dual-Use Goods and Technologies or other applicable export control list) and shall notify the BUYER Procurement Representative in writing of any changes to the export classification information of the item or controlled data. SELLER represents that an official authorized to bind the SELLER has determined that the SELLER or the designer, manufacturer, supplier or other source of the Work has properly determined their export classification.

- (c) SELLER shall not export, re-export, transfer, disclose or otherwise provide or make accessible BUYER's technical data and/or hardware controlled by Trade Control Laws ("Export Controlled Information") to any persons, or entities not authorized to receive or have access to the data, services and/or hardware, including third country/dual national employees, lower-tier subcontractors and sub-licensees, or modify or divert such Export Controlled Information to any military application unless SELLER receives advance, written authorization from BUYER and verification of any required export authorization is in place. SELLER shall not provide a defense service as defined by the Trade Control Laws using any or all of BUYER's technical data and/or hardware. Upon BUYER's request, SELLER shall demonstrate to BUYER's reasonable satisfaction, SELLER's and SELLER's lower-tier subcontractors' compliance with this clause and all Trade Control Laws. To the extent SELLER's Work provided under this Contract include packing, labeling, processing, and/or handling exports for BUYER, SELLER shall maintain an auditable process that assures accurate packing, labeling, processing, and handling of such exports. SELLER shall also promptly notify BUYER if it becomes aware of any failure by SELLER or SELLER's lower-tier subcontractors to comply with this clause and shall cooperate with BUYER in any investigation of such failure to comply.
- (d) SELLER hereby represents that neither SELLER nor any parent, subsidiary or affiliate of SELLER is included on any of the restricted party lists maintained by the U.S. Government, including the Specially Designated Nationals List administered by the U.S. Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control ("OFAC"), Denied Parties List, Unverified List or Entity List maintained by the U.S. Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security ("BIS"), or the List of Statutorily Debarred Parties maintained by the U.S. State Department's Directorate of Defense Trade Controls, or the consolidated list of asset freeze targets designated by the United Nations, European Union, and United Kingdom (collectively, "Restricted Party Lists"). SELLER shall immediately notify the BUYER Procurement Representative if SELLER, or any parent, subsidiary or affiliate of SELLER becomes listed on any Restricted Party List or if SELLER's export privileges are otherwise denied, suspended or revoked in whole or in part by any U.S. or non-U.S. government entity or agency.
- (e) If SELLER is engaged in the business of exporting manufacturing (whether exporting or not) or brokering defense articles or furnishing defense services, SELLER represents that it is and will continue to be registered with the Directorate of Defense Trade Controls, as required by the ITAR, and it maintains an effective export/import compliance program in accordance with the ITAR.
- (f) Where SELLER is a party to or signatory under a BUYER Technical Assistance Agreement (TAA) or Manufacturing License Agreement (MLA), license exception or license exemption, collectively, "Export Authorization," SELLER shall provide prompt notification to the BUYER Procurement Representative in the event of (1) changed circumstances including, but not limited to, ineligibility, a violation or potential violation of the ITAR or other applicable governmental restrictions, and the initiation or existence of a U.S. Government investigation, that could affect SELLER's performance under this Contract, or (2) any

change by SELLER that might require BUYER to submit an amendment to an existing Export Authorization or request a new or replacement Export Authorization. SELLER shall provide to BUYER all information and documentation as may reasonably be required for BUYER to prepare and submit any required export license applications. Delays on SELLER's part to submit the relevant information for export licenses shall not constitute an excusable delay under this Contract.

- (g) Upon completion of performance of this Contract, SELLER and its lower-tier subcontractors shall as directed by BUYER, return or destroy all export controlled technical data, technology, hardware or other items. SELLER shall provide a certificate of destruction for all destroyed items.
- (h) SELLER shall include paragraphs (a) through (g) and this paragraph (h) of this clause or equivalent provisions in lower-tier subcontracts for the delivery of items that will be included in or delivered as Work to BUYER. SELLER shall immediately notify BUYER upon learning that any lower-tier subcontractor with which it engages has become listed on the Restricted Parties List.
- (i) SELLER shall be responsible for all losses, costs, claims, causes of action, damages, liabilities and expense, including attorney's fees, all expense of litigation and/or settlement, and court costs, arising from any act or omission of SELLER, its officers, employees, agents, suppliers, or subcontractors at any tier, in the performance of any of its obligations under this clause.

13. EXTRAS

Work shall not be supplied in excess of quantities specified in this Contract. SELLER shall be liable for handling charges and return shipment costs for any excess quantities.

14. FURNISHED PROPERTY

- (a) BUYER may, by written authorization, provide to SELLER property owned by either BUYER or its customer (Furnished Property). Furnished Property shall be used only for the performance of this Contract.
- (b) Title to Furnished Property shall remain in BUYER or its customer. SELLER shall clearly mark (if not so marked) all Furnished Property to show its ownership.
- (c) Except for reasonable wear and tear, SELLER shall be responsible for, and shall promptly notify BUYER of any loss or damage to Furnished Property. Without additional charge, SELLER shall manage, maintain, and preserve Furnished Property in accordance with applicable law, the requirements of this Contract and good commercial practice.
- (d) At BUYER's request, and/or upon completion of this Contract, SELLER shall submit, in an acceptable form, inventory lists of Furnished Property and shall deliver or make such other disposal as may be directed by BUYER.

15. GRATUITIES/KICKBACKS

SELLER shall not offer or give a kickback or gratuity (in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise) for the purpose of obtaining or rewarding favorable treatment as a BUYER supplier.

16. INDEMNITY

SELLER shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless BUYER, its officers, directors, employees, consultants, agents, affiliates, successors, permitted assigns and customers from and against all losses, costs, claims, causes of action, damages, liabilities, and expenses, including attorney's fees, all expenses of litigation and/or settlement, and court costs, arising from any act or omission of SELLER, its officers, employees, agents, suppliers, or subcontractors at any tier, in the performance of any of its obligations under this Contract.

17. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR RELATIONSHIP

SELLER is an independent contractor in all its operations and activities hereunder. The employees used by SELLER to perform Work under this Contract shall be SELLER's employees exclusively without any relation whatsoever to BUYER.

18. INFORMATION ASSURANCE

- (a) Information provided by BUYER to SELLER remains the property of BUYER. SELLER shall comply with the terms of any proprietary information agreement with BUYER and comply with all proprietary information markings and restrictive legends applied by BUYER to anything provided hereunder to SELLER. SELLER shall not use any BUYER provided information for any purpose except to perform this Contract and shall not disclose such information to third parties without the prior written consent of BUYER. SELLER shall maintain data protection processes and systems sufficient to adequately protect BUYER provided information and comply with any law or regulation applicable to such information.
- (b)If SELLER becomes aware of any compromise of information used in the performance of this Contract or provided by BUYER to SELLER, its officers, employees, agents, suppliers, or subcontractors (an "Incident"), SELLER shall take appropriate immediate actions to investigate and contain the Incident and any associated risks, including notification within seventy-two (72) hours to BUYER after learning of the Incident. As used in this clause, "compromise" means that information has been exposed to unauthorized access, inadvertent disclosure, known misuse, loss, destruction, or alteration other than as required to perform the Work. SELLER shall provide reasonable cooperation to BUYER in conducting any investigation regarding the nature and scope of any Incident. Any costs incurred in investigating or remedying Incidents shall be borne by SELLER.
- (c) Any BUYER provided information identified as proprietary or subject to restrictions on public disclosure by law or regulation shall be encrypted (i) if transmitted via the Internet, or (ii) during electronic storage if potentially accessible by the Internet or otherwise by non-authorized users.
- (d) The provisions set forth above are in addition to and do not alter, change or supersede any obligations contained in a proprietary information agreement between the parties.

19. INFORMATION OF SELLER

SELLER shall not provide any proprietary information to BUYER without prior execution of a proprietary information agreement by the parties.

20. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

- (a) BUYER and its customer may inspect all Work at reasonable times and places, including, when practicable, during manufacture and before shipment. SELLER shall provide all information, facilities, and assistance necessary for safe and convenient inspection without additional charge.
- (b)No such inspection shall relieve SELLER of its obligations to furnish and warrant all Work in accordance with the requirements of this Contract. BUYER's final inspection and acceptance shall be at destination.
- (c) If SELLER delivers non-conforming Work, BUYER may, in addition to any other remedies available at law or at equity: (i) accept all or part of such Work at an equitable price reduction; or (ii) reject such Work; or (iii) require SELLER, at SELLER's cost, to make all repairs, modifications, or replacements at the direction of BUYER necessary to enable such Work to comply in all respects with Contract requirements.
- (d) SELLER shall not re-tender rejected Work without disclosing the corrective action taken.

21. INSURANCE

- (a) SELLER and its subcontractors shall maintain for the performance of this Contract the following insurances:
- (1) Workers' compensation insurance meeting the statutory requirements where Work will be performed;
- (2) Employer's liability (EL) in the amount of \$1 million per each accident or per each employee for disease;
- (3) Commercial general liability (CGL) including Products Liability and Completed Operations liability in the amount of \$5 million per occurrence, or in such higher amounts as BUYER may require;
- (4) If Seller is performing Professional Services on behalf of Buyer, Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of no less than \$5,000,000;
- (5) Automobile liability (AL) insurance covering third party bodily injury and property damage with a minimum of \$1 million per occurrence limit, or in such higher amounts as BUYER may require; and
- (6) Such other insurance as BUYER may require.
- (b) SELLER shall provide BUYER thirty (30) days advance written notice prior to the effective date of any cancellation or change in the term or coverage of any of SELLER's required insurance, provided however such notice shall not relieve SELLER of its obligations to maintain the required insurance. SELLER shall have its' insurers name BUYER as an additional insured on the CGL and AL policies for the duration of this Contract. If requested, SELLER shall provide a "Certificate of Insurance" evidencing SELLER's compliance with these requirements. Insurance maintained pursuant to this clause shall be considered primary as respects the interest of BUYER and is not contributory with any insurance which BUYER may carry. "Subcontractor" as used in this clause shall include SELLER's subcontractors at any tier. SELLER's obligations herein for procuring and maintaining insurance coverage are freestanding and are not affected by any other language in this Contract.

22. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Paragraph (a) is NOT applicable for commercial off-the-shelf Work unless such Work is modified or redesigned pursuant to this Contract.

- (a) SELLER agrees that BUYER shall be the owner of all inventions, technology, designs, works of authorship, mask works, technical information, computer software, business information and other information conceived, developed or otherwise generated in the performance of this Contract by or on behalf of SELLER. SELLER hereby assigns and agrees to assign all right, title, and interest in the foregoing to BUYER, including without limitation all copyrights, patent rights and other intellectual property rights therein and further agrees to execute, at BUYER's request and expense, all documentation necessary to perfect title therein in BUYER. SELLER shall maintain and disclose to BUYER written records of, and otherwise provide BUYER with full access to, the subject matter covered by this clause and that all such subject matter will be deemed information of BUYER and subject to the protection provisions of the clause entitled "Information Assurance." SELLER shall assist BUYER, at BUYER's request and expense, in every reasonable way, in obtaining, maintaining, and enforcing patent and other intellectual property protection on the subject matter covered by this clause.
- (b) SELLER warrants that the Work performed or delivered under this Contract will not infringe or otherwise violate the intellectual property rights of any third party in the United States or any foreign country. SELLER shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless BUYER, its officers, directors, employees, consultants, agents, affiliates, successors, permitted assigns and customers from and against all losses, costs, claims, causes of action, damages, liabilities, and expenses, including attorney's fees, all expenses of litigation and/or settlement, and court costs, arising out of any action by a third party that is based upon a claim that the Work performed or delivered under this Contract infringes or otherwise violates the intellectual property rights of any person or entity.
- (c) To the extent that any pre-existing inventions, technology, designs, works of authorship, mask works, technical information, computer software, and other information or materials are used, included, or contained in the Work or deliverable items and not owned by BUYER pursuant to this or a previous agreement with SELLER, SELLER grants to BUYER an irrevocable, nonexclusive, world-wide, royalty-free license to: (i) make, have made, sell, offer for sale, use, execute, reproduce, display, perform, distribute (internally or externally) copies of, transfer computer software, and prepare derivative works based upon, such pre-existing inventions, technology, designs, works of authorship, mask works, technical information, computer software, and other information or materials and derivative works thereof; and (ii) authorize others to do any, some or all of the foregoing.
- (d) The tangible medium storing copies of all reports, memoranda or other materials in written form including machine readable form, prepared by SELLER and furnished to BUYER pursuant to this Contract shall become the sole property of BUYER.
- (e) No other provision in this Contract, including but not limited to the Indemnity clause, shall be construed to limit the liabilities or remedies of the parties under this clause.

23. NEW MATERIALS

The Work to be delivered hereunder shall consist of new materials, not used, or reconditioned, remanufactured, or of such age as to impair its usefulness or safety.

24. OFFSET CREDIT/COOPERATION

This Contract has been entered into in direct support of BUYER's international offset programs. All offset benefit credits resulting from this Contract are the sole property of BUYER to be applied to the offset program of its choice. SELLER shall assist BUYER in securing appropriate offset credits from the respective country government authorities.

25. PACKING AND SHIPMENT

- (a) Unless otherwise specified, all Work is to be packed in accordance with good commercial practice.
- (b) A complete packing list shall be enclosed with all shipments. SELLER shall mark containers or packages with necessary lifting, loading, and shipping information, including the BUYER Contract number, item number, dates of shipment, and the names and addresses of consignor and consignee. Bills of lading shall include this Contract number.
- (c) Unless otherwise specified, delivery shall be DAP Buyer's facility (Incoterm 2010).

26. PAYMENTS, TAXES, AND DUTIES

- (a) Unless otherwise provided, terms of payment shall be net ninety (90) days from latest of the following: (1) BUYER's receipt of SELLER's proper invoice; (2) scheduled completion of performance date of the Work; or (3) actual completion of performance of the Work.
- (b) Each payment made shall be subject to reduction to the extent of amounts which are found by BUYER or SELLER not to have been properly payable, and shall also be subject to reduction for overpayments. SELLER shall promptly notify BUYER of any such overpayments and remit the amount of the overpayment except as otherwise directed by BUYER.
- (c) BUYER shall have a right of setoff against payments due or at issue under this Contract or any other Contract between the parties. (d) Payment shall be deemed to have been made as of the date of mailing BUYER's payment or electronic funds transfer.
- (e) Unless otherwise specified, prices include all applicable federal, state, and local taxes, duties, tariffs, and similar fees imposed by any government, all of which shall be listed separately on the invoice.

27. PLACE OF PERFORMANCE

If SELLER intends to change the place of performance of Work under this Contract from the place(s) identified in SELLER's proposal, SELLER shall provide prior written notice to BUYER. Notification of changes to the place of performance from within the United States to a location outside the United States shall be provided by SELLER to BUYER at least six months in advance.

28. PRECEDENCE

Any inconsistencies in this Contract shall be resolved in accordance with the following descending order of precedence: (1) Face of the Purchase Order and/or Task Order, release document, or schedule, (including any continuation sheets), as applicable, including any special terms and conditions; (2) these Terms and Conditions of Purchase; (3) the Statement of Work; and (4) QA-100-001.

29. QUALITY CONTROL SYSTEM

- (a) SELLER shall comply in full with the requirements of QA-100-001 unless expressly stated otherwise on the face of the Purchase Order and/or Task Order.
- (b) SELLER shall provide and maintain a quality control system to an industry recognized Quality Standard and in compliance with any other specific quality requirements identified in this Contract or QA-100-001.
- (c) Records of all quality control inspection work by SELLER shall be kept complete and available to BUYER and its customers.

30. INSPECTION AND AUDIT RIGHTS

- 1. Supplier (which, for the purposes of this Section, includes Supplier's suppliers, subcontractors and business partners) shall at any time, and after reasonable notice by Buyer, (i) grant to Buyer, Buyer's Customers and/or to any competent regulatory authority, unrestricted access to (or if requested by Buyer, provide to Buyer copies of) Supplier's books records and documentation (including, without limitation, inspection those pertaining to quality, and testing of Goods and Services, security and data protection procedures, ethics and compliance programs and any other requirement or obligation under the Order), but excluding financial books and records), wherever such books and records may be located (including thirdparty repositories and at facilities of Supplier's suppliers, subcontractors, and business partners used in connection with the Order)), and (ii) provide Buyer, Buyer's Customers and/or any such authority the right to access, and to perform any type of inspection, test, audit or investigation at Supplier's premises, including without limitation, manufacturing and test locations and the facilities of Supplier's suppliers, subcontractors and business partners used in connection with the Order for the purpose of enabling Buyer to verify compliance with the requirements set forth in the Order or for any other purpose indicated by Buyer's Customers and/or said authority in connection with the design, development, certification, manufacture, sale, use and/or support of the Goods. Supplier and its suppliers, subcontractors and business partners shall cooperate with Buyer and Buyer's Customers and/or any such authority to furnish all reasonable facilities for and assistance with the safe performance of , . Inspections, tests, audits and/or investigations in connection with any Order and Goods and Services thereunder.
- 2. Supplier shall maintain complete inspection records for all Goods which shall be available to Buyer during performance of an Order and until the later of: (ii) final resolution of any dispute involving the Goods delivered hereunder, (iii) the latest time required by an Order, (iv) the latest time required by applicable laws and regulations, (v) the latest time required by QA-100-001 version effective as of the date of the Order, or (vi) as otherwise directed by Buyer.
- 3. Any corrective action requested by Buyer, Buyer's Customers and/or any said authority following any such inspection, test, audit or investigation shall be implemented by Supplier at Supplier's cost.
- 4. In addition to any other inspection or audit rights granted to Buyer hereunder, Buyer may inspect and audit, on reasonable notice, Supplier's financial books and records if the Order: (i) is a time and material order, (ii) is a cost-based order, or (iii) provides for advance or progress payments based on costs incurred by Supplier.

5. The supplier shall ensure that their employees are aware of their contribution to product safety or service conformity, their contribution to product safety, and the importance of ethical behavior.

31. RELEASE OF INFORMATION

Except as required by law, no public release of any information, or confirmation or denial of same, with respect to this Contract or the subject matter hereof, will be made by SELLER or its subcontractors without the prior written approval of BUYER. SELLER shall not use "BUYER," "BUYER Corporation," or any other trademark or logo owned by BUYER, in whatever shape or form, without the prior written consent of BUYER.

32. RETENTION OF RECORDS

Unless a longer period is specified in this Contract or by law or regulation, SELLER shall retain all records related to this Contract as specified on QA-100-001. Records related to this Contract include, but are not limited to, financial, proposal, procurement, specifications, production, inspection, test, quality, shipping and export, and certification records. At no additional cost, SELLER shall timely provide access to such records to the US Government and/or BUYER upon request.

33. SEVERABILITY

Each clause, paragraph and subparagraph of this Contract is severable, and if one or more of them are declared invalid, the remaining provisions of this Contract will remain in full force and effect.

34. STOP WORK

- (a) SELLER shall stop Work for up to ninety (90) days in accordance with any written notice received from BUYER, or for such longer period of time as the parties may agree and shall take all reasonable steps to minimize the incurrence of costs allocable to the Work during the period of Work stoppage.
- (b) Within such period, BUYER shall either terminate in accordance with the provisions of this Contract or continue the Work by written notice to SELLER. In the event of a continuation, an equitable adjustment in accordance with the principles of the "Changes" clause shall be made to the price, delivery schedule, or other provision(s) affected by the Work stoppage, if applicable, provided that the claim for equitable adjustment is made within thirty (30) days after date of notice to continue.

35. SURVIVABILITY

All rights, obligations, and duties hereunder, which by their nature or by their express terms extend beyond the expiration or termination of this Contract, including but not limited to warranties, indemnifications, intellectual property (including rights to and protection of intellectual property and proprietary information), and product support obligations shall survive the expiration or termination of this Contract.

36. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

(a) BUYER reserves the right to terminate this Contract, or any part hereof, for its convenience. BUYER shall terminate by delivering to SELLER a Notice of Termination specifying the extent of termination and the effective date. In the event of such termination, SELLER shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the

terms of this Contract, SELLER shall be paid a percentage of the Contract price reflecting the percentage of the Work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges SELLER can demonstrate to the satisfaction of BUYER using its standard record keeping system have resulted from the termination. SELLER shall not be paid for any Work performed or costs incurred which reasonably could have been avoided.

- (b) In no event shall BUYER be liable for lost or anticipated profits, or unabsorbed indirect costs or overhead, or for any sum in excess of the total Contract price. SELLER's termination claim shall be submitted within ninety (90) days from the effective date of the termination.
- (c) SELLER shall continue all Work not terminated.

37. TIMELY PERFORMANCE

- (a) SELLER's timely performance is a critical element of this Contract.
- (b) Unless advance shipment has been authorized in writing by BUYER, BUYER may store at SELLER's expense, or return, shipping charges collect, all Work received in advance of the scheduled delivery date.
- (c) SELLER shall provide BUYER status of performance of this Contract when requested. In addition, if SELLER becomes aware of an impending labor dispute involving SELLER or any lower tier subcontractor, or any other difficulty in performing the Work, SELLER shall timely notify BUYER, in writing, giving pertinent details. These notifications shall not change any delivery schedule.
- (d) In the event of a termination for convenience or change, no claim will be allowed for any manufacture or procurement in advance of SELLER's normal flow time unless there has been prior written consent by BUYER.

38. TRAVEL COSTS

- (a) All travel incurred by SELLER in the performance of this Contract is included within the Contract price and shall not be separately reimbursed by BUYER unless such travel is expressly authorized in writing in advance by BUYER's Procurement Representative.
- (b) When travel is authorized under this Contract, SELLER shall be reimbursed only for necessary, reasonable, and actual travel expenses for transportation, lodging, meals and incidental expenses only to the extent that they do not exceed the maximum per diem rate in effect at the time of travel, as set forth in the United States Federal Travel Regulations for the area of travel authorized under this Contract. Air travel shall be reimbursed for coach class only. SELLER shall provide a detailed summary of all such costs by category of expense with each invoice. SELLER shall provide a legible receipt for each claimed individual expense.

39. US GOVERNMENT SUBCONTRACTS

The flow down of additional clauses, including those of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) or the Defense Federal Acquisition Supplement (DFARS) may be required for contracts issued under prime contracts with the U.S. Government or subcontracts at any tier under U.S. Government contracts. To the extent that any such clauses are or may become applicable to this Contract, those clauses are hereby

incorporated into the applicable Section of this Agreement with the same force and effect as if they had been incorporated herein in their entirety.

40. WAIVERS, APPROVALS, AND REMEDIES

- (a) Failure by either party to enforce any of the provisions of this Contract or applicable law shall not constitute a waiver of the requirements of such provisions or law, or as a waiver of the right of a party thereafter to enforce such provision or law.
- (b)BUYER's approval of documents shall not relieve SELLER of its obligation to comply with the requirements of this Contract.
- (c) The rights and remedies of either party in this Contract are cumulative and in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or in equity.

41. WARRANTY

SELLER warrants that all Work furnished pursuant to this Contract shall strictly conform to applicable specifications, drawings, samples, descriptions, and other requirements of this Contract and be free from defects in design, material, and workmanship. This warranty shall begin upon final acceptance and extend for a period of three (3) years. If any nonconforming Work is identified within the warranty period, SELLER, at BUYER's option, shall promptly repair, replace, or re-perform the Work. Transportation of replacement Work, return of nonconforming Work, and re-performance of Work shall be at SELLER's expense. If repair, or replacement, or re-performance of Work is not timely, BUYER may elect to return, re-perform, repair, replace, or re-procure the non-conforming Work at SELLER's expense. All warranties shall run to BUYER and its customers.

42. WORK ON BUYER AND THIRD PARTY PREMISES

- (a) "Premises" as used in this clause means premises of BUYER, its customers, or other third parties where Work is being performed.
- (b) SELLER shall ensure that SELLER personnel working on Premises comply with any on-premises policies and: (i) do not bring weapons of any kind onto Premises; (ii) do not manufacture, sell, distribute, possess, use or be under the influence of controlled substances or alcoholic beverages while on Premises; (iii) do not possess hazardous materials of any kind on Premises without BUYER's authorization; (iv) remain in authorized areas only; (v) do not conduct any non-BUYER related business activities (such as interviews, hirings, dismissals or personal solicitations) on Premises, (vi) do not send or receive non-BUYER related mail through BUYER's or third party's mail systems; (vii) do not sell, advertise or market any products or memberships, distribute printed, written or graphic materials on Premises without BUYER's written permission or as permitted by law; and (viii) follow instruction from BUYER in the event of an actual or imminent safety or environmental hazard on Premises.
- (c) All persons, property, and vehicles entering or leaving Premises are subject to search.
- (d) SELLER shall promptly notify BUYER and provide a report of any accidents or security incidents involving loss of or misuse or damage to BUYER, customer, or third party intellectual or physical assets, and all physical altercations, assaults, or harassment.

- (e)(1) Prior to entry on Premises, SELLER shall coordinate with BUYER to gain access. SELLER shall provide information reasonably required by BUYER to ensure proper identification of personnel, including, but not limited to verification of citizenship, lawful permanent resident status, protected individual or other status.
- (f) SELLER shall ensure that SELLER personnel: (i) do not remove BUYER, customer, or third party assets from Premises without BUYER authorization; (ii) use BUYER, customer, or third party assets only for purposes of this Contract; (iii) only connect with, interact with or use computer resources, networks, programs, tools or routines authorized by BUYER; and (iv) do not share or disclose user identifiers, passwords, cipher keys or computer dial port telephone numbers. BUYER may periodically audit SELLER's data residing on BUYER, customer, or third party assets on Premises.
- (g) BUYER may, at its sole discretion, have SELLER remove any specified employee of SELLER from Premises and require that such employee not be reassigned to any Premises under this Contract.
- (h) Violation of this clause may result in termination of this Contract in addition to any other remedy available to BUYER at law or in equity. SELLER shall reimburse BUYER, customer, or third party for any unauthorized use of BUYER, customer, or third party assets.
- (i)SELLER shall advise the BUYER Procurement Representative of any unauthorized direction or course of conduct.
- (j)SELLER shall immediately report to BUYER all emergencies (e.g., medical, fire, spills or release of any hazardous material) and non-emergency incidents (e.g., job-related injuries or illnesses) affecting the Work. SELLER shall provide BUYER with a copy of any reports of such incidents SELLER makes to governmental authorities.
